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Chair, Sen. Waddoups called the meeting to order at 2:16 p.m.

The Analyst presented FY 2002 budget recommendations for the Department of Environmental Quality as follows:

Water Quality	\$7,971,600
Intent Language	<i>“It is the intent of the Legislature that any unexpended Groundwater Permit Administration fees are non-lapsing and authorized for use in the Groundwater Permit Administration Program in the following fiscal year to reduce the fees charged.”</i>
Drinking Water	\$3,150,300
Solid and Hazardous Waste	\$6,281,500
Radiation Control	\$1,584,900

Charles Judd, President of Envirocare of Utah, Inc. gave a briefing on their disposal facility in Tooele County. They have a license to dispose of “A” waste and have applied for a permit to also dispose of containerized radioactive “A” waste.

DEQ gave an agency response, led by Diane Nelson and Bill Sinclair

Sen. Waddoups yielded the chair to Rep. Bush and was excused from the remainder of the meeting.

The Analyst continued FY 2002 budget recommendations for the Department of Environmental Quality as follows:

Division of Air Quality	\$6,951,500
Intent Language	<i>“It is the intent of the Legislature that any unexpended funds in the Air Operating Permit Program are non-lapsing and authorized for use in the Operating Permit Program in FY 2002 to reduce emission fees.”</i>
Environmental Response & Remediation	\$11,092,000

The total Analyst recommendation for FY 2002 for the Department of Environmental Quality is \$41,471,900.

MOTION: Sen. Peterson moved the Analyst Budget of \$41,471,900 be approved and add the FTE's and the fees that go along with it.
