State Olympic Officer Creation.</li> <li>(1) There is created the position of State Olympic Officer.</li> <li>(2) Beginning July 1, 1997: <ul> <li>(a) The State Olympic Officer shall be an individual appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the Senate.</li> <li>(b) The officer serves at the pleasure of the governor.</li> <li>(c) The officer shall be experienced in administration, financial, and legal transactions, and coordination of complex organizations.</li> <li>(d) The officer shall receive compensation as provided by Title 67, Chapter 22, State Officer Compensation.</li> <li>(e) The officer may appoint [one] additional staff [member] members with the approval of the governor.</li> <li>(f) The Office of Planning and Budget shall provide staff support and physical facilities to the coordinator.</li> <li>(g) Except as provided in Subsection(3), beginning July 1, 1997, the salary, benefits, and administrative costs associated with the officer and [an individual] individuals appointed by the officer under Subsection (2)(e) shall be paid from the Olympics special revenue fund or funds established under Section 59-12-103.</li> <li>(3) (a) If there is inadequate monies in the Olympics special revenue fund or funds to pay the salary, benefits, and administrative cost may be paid from the General Fund.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
		(b) If monies are paid from the General Fund under Subsection

(3)(a), the monies shall be reimbursed to the General Fund from the Olympics special revenue fund or funds at such time the Olympics special revenue fund or funds has adequate monies to reimburse the General Fund.

(c) Notwithstanding Subsections (2)(e), (3)(a), and (3)(b), the salary, benefits, or administrative costs associated with the officer may not be paid from the sales and tax revenues generated by municipalities or counties and deposited under Subsection 59-12-103(4)(a)(ii)."
