7 **This act modifies provisions related to Occupational and Professional Licensing by**
8 **allowing the director of the Division of Occupational and Professional Licensing to**
9 **employ and designate investigators as special function officers.**

10 This act affects sections of Utah Code Annotated 1953 as follows:

11 AMENDS:

12 **58-1-105**, as renumbered and amended by Chapter 297, Laws of Utah 1993

13 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*

14 Section 1. Section **58-1-105** is amended to read:

15 **58-1-105. Employment of staff.**

16 (1) The director, with the approval of the executive director, may employ necessary
17 staff, including investigators, specialists, and professionals, to assist [him] the director in
18 performing the duties, functions, and responsibilities of the division.

19 (2) An investigator employed under Subsection (1) shall be designated a special
20 function officer, as defined in Section 53-13-105, but is not eligible for retirement benefits
21 under the Public Safety Noncontributory Retirement System.
