CAPTIVE INSURERS ACT**H.B. 372***James A. Dunnigan*

THIS ACT MODIFIES THE INSURANCE CODE TO ENACT PROVISIONS PROVIDING FOR THE REGULATION AND OPERATION OF CAPTIVE INSURANCE COMPANIES. THE ACT REGULATES THE SCOPE OF BUSINESS, REQUIREMENTS FOR INCORPORATION, CERTIFICATES OF AUTHORITY, FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY, AND ANNUAL REPORTS. THE ACT PROVIDES FOR INSPECTIONS AND EXAMINATIONS AND ESTABLISHES GROUNDS FOR SUSPENSION AND REVOCATION. THE ACT ESTABLISHES INVESTMENT REQUIREMENTS AND PREMIUM TAXES, AND PROVIDES PROCEDURES FOR CERTAIN CONVERSIONS AND MERGERS. THE ACT TAKES EFFECT JULY 1, 2003, read the first time by short title and referred to the Rules Committee.
