49 (d) the signature and printed name and address of each person for whom a notarial act

76 **46-1-15. Safekeeping and custody of journal -- Inspection of journal.**

77 ~~[If a notary maintains a journal, the]~~ (1) A notary shall:

78 ~~[(1)]~~ (a) safeguard the notary's official journal and all other notarial records [as
79 valuable public documents and may not destroy the documents; and];

80 ~~[(2)]~~ (b) keep the notary's official journal in the exclusive custody of the notary[; not
81 to]; and

82 (c) allow inspection of the notary's official journal without restriction:

83 (i) by a law enforcement officer in the course of an official investigation;

84 (ii) if subpoenaed by a court order; or

85 (iii) at the direction of the lieutenant governor.

86 (2) A notary may not destroy the notary's official journal or any other notarial records.

87 (3) A notary's official journal may not:
