Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section **58-72-304** is amended to read:

58-72-304. Exceptions from licensure.

In addition to the exemptions from licensure set forth in Section 58-1-307, the following persons may engage in the practice of acupuncture subject to the stated



28 circumstances and limitations without being licensed under this chapter:

29 (1) an individual licensed as a physician and surgeon or osteopathic physician and
30 surgeon under Chapter 67, Utah Medical Practice Act, and Chapter 68, Utah Osteopathic
31 Medical Practice Act; ~~and~~

32 (2) a commissioned physician or surgeon serving in the armed forces of the United
33 States or other federal agency[-]; and

34 (3) a chiropractic physician licensed under Chapter 73, Chiropractic Physician Practice
