30 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*

31 Section 1. Section **23-19-22.1** is enacted to read:

32 **23-19-22.1. Special big game hunting permits on Antelope Island.**

33 (1) The Wildlife Board may make rules relating to the issuance of special hunting
34 permits for hunting on Antelope Island.

35 (2) If provided for by rule, the permits in Subsection (1) shall be issued as follows:

36 (a) two permits issued annually for taking deer on Antelope Island from November 10
37 to December 10;

38 (b) two permits issued annually for taking big horn sheep on Antelope Island from
39 October 20 to November 20; and

40 (c) two permits issued annually for taking bison on Antelope Island from December 10
41 to December 24.

42 Section 2. Section **63-11-19.3** is enacted to read:

43 **63-11-19.3. Access to Antelope Island for special hunting and camping privileges.**

44 (1) If the Wildlife Board provides by rule that special hunting permits may be issued
45 under the provision of Section 23-19-22.1, the hunting parties shall be allowed foot access and
46 access for camping on Antelope Island for the following:

47 (a) two parties of deer hunters;

48 (b) two parties of big horn sheep hunters; and

49 (c) two parties of bison hunters.

50 (2) A party shall consist of no more than five people and five horses.

51 Section 3. Section **63-55b-123** is amended to read:

52 **63-55b-123. Repeal dates -- Title 23.**

53 Section 23-19-22.1 is repealed December 31, 2009.

54 Section 4. Section **63-55b-163** is amended to read:

55 **63-55b-163. Repeal dates -- Title 63.**

56 (1) Section 63-11-19.3 is repealed December 31, 2009.

57 [+] (2) Section 63-38a-105 is repealed July 1, 2007.

58 [(-)] (3) Sections 63-63b-101 and 63-63b-102 are repealed on July 1, 2007.

59 Section 5. **Effective date.**

State Impact

This bill allows (but does not require) the Wildlife Board to make rules for issuance of hunting permits on Antelope Island, and its implementation will have no fiscal impact. If the Board chooses to do that, both the Division of Parks and Recreation and the Division of Wildlife Resources will have a revenue increase from the sale of the hunting permits of \$1,100 each.
