Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the state of Utah:

WHEREAS, Carole E. Peterson is the first woman ever to be appointed Chief Clerk of the Utah House of Representatives;

WHEREAS, Carole has served on the House staff for over 30 years;

WHEREAS, earlier in Carole's service, she held various positions, including committee secretary, administrative secretary, engrossing clerk, and minute clerk;

WHEREAS, in 1985, Carole was appointed Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives by Speaker Robert H. Garff;

WHEREAS, in addition to her many duties, Carole has greatly aided the work of the House through her encyclopedic knowledge of parliamentary procedure and House rules;

WHEREAS, during her tenure as Chief Clerk, Carole has effectively resolved multiple administrative challenges for the House of Representatives;

WHEREAS, Carole has efficiently coordinated the House's transition from a paper-based bill tracking system to an electronic system and has conceived of and implemented creative systems and processes to allow individual House members and the Legislature as a whole to function more effectively;

WHEREAS, Carole used her expertise to benefit all state legislatures by serving on the

National Conference of State Legislatures committee that updated Mason's Manual of Legislative Procedure, the definitive guide to legislative procedure;

WHEREAS, Carole is currently serving as the staff vice-chair of the National Conference of State Legislatures Legislative Effectiveness and State Government Standing Committee;

WHEREAS, Carole has been a member of the American Society of Legislative Clerks and Secretaries for over 20 years, and served as its president in 1997;

WHEREAS, Carole was instrumental in Utah's success in hosting the National Conference of State Legislatures in 2004 by recruiting and managing the volunteers that did so much to make that conference a success;

WHEREAS, Carole provided the House with an effective and efficient part-time session staff by carefully recruiting and supervising competent, friendly people;

WHEREAS, Carole has been fiercely loyal and committed to the House of Representatives and has actively defended and asserted its role as a vital institution in our representative democracy;

WHEREAS, Carole has acted fairly and impartially to assist and nurture each member of the House, regardless of political affiliation or philosophy;

WHEREAS, despite her many responsibilities, Carole still found time to be active in Little League Baseball, where she served as a manager and was selected by her fellow coaches to coach the all-star team;

WHEREAS, despite her passionate commitment to the Utah House of Representatives, Carole has always strived to put her family first: her husband, John, daughter Jan and sons David and Phillip, and her ten grandchildren;

WHEREAS, Carole has decided to retire effective November 15, 2005, with over 30 years of service to the state of Utah; and

WHEREAS, Carole's tireless and unselfish service has made the state of Utah, the Utah Legislature, and particularly the Utah House of Representatives stronger, more open, and more effective servants of Utah's citizens:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the House of Representatives of the state

of Utah recognizes the outstanding service of Carole E. Peterson, Chief Clerk of the House, for her more than 30 years of committed service to the House of Representatives, to all of its members, past and present, and to the citizens of the state of Utah.
