(vi) a regular salaried employee of a licensed property management company who performs support services, as prescribed by rule, for the property management company.

(A) Title 57, Chapter 11, Utah Uniform Land Sales Practices Act § and

(iii) any person whose interest as an owner or lessor was obtained by ~~{-him-}~~ that person or transferred to ~~{-him-}~~ that person for the purpose of evading the application of this chapter, and not for any other legitimate business reason.

(2) A license under this chapter is not required for:

(a) isolated transactions by persons holding a duly executed power of attorney from the owner;

(b) services rendered by an attorney at law in performing ~~{-his-}~~ the attorney at law's duties as an attorney at law;

(c) a receiver, trustee in bankruptcy, administrator, executor, or any person acting under order of any court;

(d) a trustee or its employees under a deed of trust or a will; or

(e) any public utility, its officers, or regular salaried employees, unless performance of any of the acts set out in Subsection 61-2-2 (12) is in connection with the sale, purchase, lease, or other disposition of real estate or investment in real estate unrelated to the principal business activity of that public utility.

(3) ~~{-(a) Except as provided in Subsection (3)(b), a-}~~ A license under this chapter is not required for any person registered to act as a broker-dealer, agent, or investment advisor under the Utah and federal securities laws in the sale or the offer for sale of real estate if:

(ii) the security is registered for sale ;

(A) pursuant to the Securities Act of 1933 ; or

(B) by Title 61, Chapter 1, Utah Uniform Securities Act ~~{-}~~ ; or

STATEMENT AS TO THE MEANING OF LINES 218 AND 231 OF H.B. 38 AND THE WORK OF THE INTERIM WATER TASK FORCE

Water is one of the most scarce and valuable resources in the State of Utah. As the population of Utah continues to grow, new sources of safe and reliable water will become increasing difficult and expensive to develop. Utah's limited sources of future water supply make reuse of sewage effluent an important component in meeting future demands for water. The reuse of sewage effluent is also an important component in protecting the water quality in Utah by reducing the pollutant loading to streams and rivers. Reuse of sewage effluent will increase the life of existing treatment facilities and reduce the need for our communities to build more elaborate and expensive treatment facilities to maintain the high quality of water in our streams and rivers. The increased utilization of sewage effluent should be a significant component of the State's plan to meet the future water needs of its inhabitants, and the State should encourage and promote the reuse of sewage effluent.

In light of the foregoing, it is the purpose of the Wastewater Reuse Act and the policy of the State of Utah to encourage, promote, and implement beneficial reuse

of sewage effluent, consistent with the rights of the owners of water rights, to better utilize, conserve, and extend Utah’s scarce and valuable water resources.

PURPOSE STATEMENT FOR H.B. 38

“One of the more difficult issues involved in obtaining the concurrence of the water community on this bill relates to the historic practices of the state water engineer’s office in dealing with water rights held by special districts such as water conservancy districts, metropolitan water districts and improvement districts. The special districts are political subdivisions of the State of Utah and quasi municipal corporations. It is current practice of the state engineer to approve water rights filed by special districts as “municipal” rights. However, in the past, some special district water right filings were approved as “domestic” rather than “municipal” while other more or less contemporary special district water filings were approved as “municipal”. If water reuse were limited to water rights that were officially classified as “municipal” by the state engineer, some special district water rights would be eligible for reuse while others would not, even though they are held by the same special district and have always been used in the same way. To clarify the intent that all water rights held by special districts are to be eligible for reuse under this legislation, language was inserted into Sections 73–3c–201 (1)(a) and 73–3c–202(1)(b) to allow a water right that has been “administered by the state engineer as a municipal water right” [LINES 218 & 231] to be eligible for reuse provided the other reuse requirements are met, even though the water right is not owned by a municipality and was not officially approved as “municipal” by the state engineer.”
