LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill modifies provisions relating to applied technology education, including merging the Salt Lake/Tooele Applied Technology College Campus with Salt Lake Community College.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

- ▶ removes the Salt Lake/Tooele Applied Technology College Campus from the Utah College of Applied Technology and transfers its functions and responsibilities to Salt Lake Community College;
- ▶ creates a college advisory council at Salt Lake Community College and specifies its membership and duties;
- ▶ modifies applied technology education reporting provisions; and
- ▶ makes technical corrections.

Other Special Clauses:

This bill takes effect on July 1, 2008.

40 Section 1. Section **53A-15-202** is amended to read:

41 **53A-15-202. Powers of the board.**

42 The State Board of Education:

43 (1) shall establish minimum standards for applied technology programs in the public
44 education system;

45 (2) may apply for, receive, administer, and distribute funds made available through
46 programs of federal and state governments to promote and aid applied technology education;

47 (3) shall cooperate with federal and state governments to administer programs which
48 promote and maintain applied technology education;

49 (4) shall cooperate with the Utah College of Applied Technology to ensure that
50 students in the public education system have access to applied technology education at Utah
51 College of Applied Technology campuses;

52 (5) shall require that before a minor student may participate in clinical experiences as
53 part of a health care occupation program at a high school or other institution to which the
54 student has been referred, the student's parent or legal guardian has:

55 (a) been first given written notice through appropriate disclosure when registering and
56 prior to participation that the program contains a clinical experience segment in which the
57 student will observe and perform specific health care procedures that may include personal
58 care, patient bathing, and bathroom assistance; and

60 clinical experience; and

71 **53B-2a-102. President -- Appointment -- Duties.**

72 (1) (a) The board shall appoint a president for the Utah College of Applied
73 Technology.

74 (b) The president of the Utah College of Applied Technology does not need to have a
75 doctorate degree, but shall have extensive experience in applied technology education.

76 (c) The president shall serve at the board's discretion.

77 (d) The names of the final candidates for president of the Utah College of Applied
78 Technology shall be publicly disclosed.

79 (e) The chair and vice chair of the Utah College of Applied Technology Board of
80 Trustees shall be members of the search committee for the president.

81 (2) The president shall:

82 (a) direct the Utah College of Applied Technology and coordinate the activities of each
83 of its college campuses;

84 (b) in cooperation with the board of trustees and with the approval of the board,
85 develop a competency-based associate of applied technology degree;

86 (c) ensure that, pursuant to State Board of Regents' rules, an applied technology
87 education degree is primarily a terminal degree, but is transferable to a bachelor's degree in
88 applied technology at other higher education institutions under specific articulation agreements;

102 (i) develop and implement a system of common definitions, standards, and criteria for
103 tracking and measuring the effectiveness of applied technology education;

123 **53B-2a-103. Utah College of Applied Technology Board of Trustees --**

124 **Membership -- Terms -- Vacancies -- Oath -- Officers -- Quorum -- Committees --**

125 **Compensation.**

126 (1) There is created the Utah College of Applied Technology Board of Trustees,
127 composed of the following members:

128 (a) two members of the State Board of Education appointed by the governor with the
129 consent of the Senate;

130 (b) two members of the State Board of Regents appointed by the governor with the
131 consent of the Senate;

132 (c) one member representing business and industry from the regional board of each
133 regional applied technology college appointed by a majority vote of the business and industry
134 members of the regional board;

135 (d) one member representing business and industry from the Snow College applied
136 technology advisory committee appointed by a majority of the business and industry members
137 of the advisory committee;

138 (e) one member representing business and industry from the College of Eastern Utah

405 ~~training specifically designed for economically disadvantaged students and educationally~~
406 ~~disadvantaged students~~] applied technology education for both secondary and adult students.

407 (c) Training at the center shall focus on immediate job entry skills.

408 (2) (a) The State Board of Regents shall exercise general control and supervision over
409 the center.

410 (b) Salt Lake Community College shall administer the center under the board's
411 supervision.

416 (a) maintain a strong curriculum in applied technology and technical courses at its
417 campus and within the region it serves which can be transferred to other institutions within the
418 higher education system, together with lower division courses and courses required for
419 associate degrees in science, arts, applied science, and applied technology;

420 (b) work with school districts in developing an aggressive concurrent enrollment
421 program; and

422 (c) provide for open-entry, open-exit competency-based applied technology education
423 programs, at the tuition rate approved by the Utah College of Applied Technology for adults

443 (1) Salt Lake Community College shall have a college advisory council composed of
444 the following 15 members:

445 (a) the career and technical education director for the Salt Lake City School District;

446 (b) the career and technical education director for the Granite School District;

447 (c) the career and technical education director for the Jordan School District;

448 (d) the career and technical education director for the Murray School District;

449 (e) the career and technical education director for the Tooele School District;

450 (f) one member of the Salt Lake Community College board of trustees appointed by the
451 president of Salt Lake Community College;

452 (g) one member appointed by the executive director of the Department of Workforce
453 Services; and

454 (h) eight representatives of business or industry within the region appointed by the

474 **Section 10. Effective date.**

475 This bill takes effect on July 1, 2008.

Legislative Review Note
