21           WHEREAS, pursuant to Utah Code Ann. Section 36-12-7, (1953), the Legislative  
22 Management Committee upon recommendation of its Budget Subcommittee, has  
23 recommended the appointment of Mr. Jonathan C. Ball as Legislative Fiscal Analyst for the  
24 Utah Legislature; and

25           WHEREAS, the appointment of Mr. Jonathan C. Ball in this position for a term of  
26 office of six years commencing July 17, 2007, is subject to further approval of a majority vote  
27 of both the House of Representatives and the Senate:



28           NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Legislature of the state of Utah that  
29 the appointment of Mr. Jonathan C. Ball as Legislative Fiscal Analyst for the Utah Legislature  
30 be approved for a six-year term of office commencing July 17, 2007.
