### **General Description:**

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This bill addresses the eligibility of charter school students and students who participate in online education programs to participate in extracurricular activities.

### **Highlighted Provisions:**

This bill:

- ► provides that a charter school student is eligible to participate in extracurricular activities not offered by the student's charter school at:
- the public school within whose boundaries the student's custodial parent or legal guardian resides; or
- the public school from which the student withdrew for the purpose of attending a charter school;
- provides that a student who participates in an online education program sponsored or supported by a school district or charter school is eligible to participate in extracurricular activities at:
- the public school within whose boundaries the student's custodial parent or legal guardian resides; or



• the public school from which the student withdrew for the purpose of
participating in an online education program; and
<ul> <li>directs the State Board of Education to make rules establishing fees for charter</li> </ul>
school students and online students to participate in extracurricular activities at a
school district school.
