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Representative **Bradley M. Daw** proposes the following amendments:

1. Page 1, Lines 22 through 23:

HOUSE COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

- establishes a pilot program, beginning on July 1, 2008, and ending on { December 1,
- 23 2009, in Davis, Salt Lake, Utah, and Weber counties July 1, 2010, for the real-time reporting of,
- 2. Page 2, Lines 31 through 35:
 - 31 requires the Division of Occupational and Professional Licensing to implement the
 - 32 pilot program established in this bill on a statewide basis on or before { December 1,
 - 33 2009, and provides that the division may implement the pilot program on a
 - 34 statewide basis at anytime after July 1, 2008, if the division and the Utah State
 - 35 Board of Pharmacy determine that the pilot program is successful 35 July 1, 2010; and
- 3. Page 5, Line 151:
 - (f) federal, state, and local law enforcement authorities <u>, and state and local prosecutors,</u> engaged as a specified duty of
- 4. Page 7, Line 211 through Page 8, Line 215:
 - 211 (i) "Pilot area" means {
 - 212 (A) Davis County;
 - 213 (B) Salt Lake County;
 - 214 (C) Utah County; and
 - 215 (D) Weber County the areas of the state that the division determines to operate the pilot program in, under Subsection (3), which may include:
 - (A) the entire state; or
 - (B) geographical areas within the state .
- 5. Page 8, Lines 218 through 231:
 - 218 (2) There is established a pilot program for real-time reporting of data to, and access to
 - data from, the database by a pharmacy, a pharmaceutical facility, or a physician beginning on
 - 220 July 1, 2008, and ending on { December 1, 2009.} July 1, 2010.
 - 221 (3) In addition to fulfilling the requirements of Sections 58-37-7.5 and 58-37-7.7 on a
 - 222 <u>statewide basis, the division shall</u> , in accordance with Subsection (4), upgrade, administer, and direct the

- 223 <u>database in</u> { <u>the pilot area</u>} <u>geographical areas</u> <u>specified by the division, or on a statewide</u>

 <u>basis</u>, in a manner that provides for real-time reporting of information
- 224 <u>entered into, and accessed from, the database by a pharmacy or pharmaceutical facility.</u>
- 225 (4) {(a)} The division {may} shall , under state procurement laws, and with the technical assistance of the Department of Technology Services, contract with {mother state}
- 226 <u>agency or</u>} <u>a</u> <u>private entity to upgrade, operate,</u> { <u>or</u>} <u>and</u> <u>maintain the database in the pilot</u> area.
- 227 { (b) The division shall collaborate with the board to determine whether to enter into a
- 228 <u>contract under Subsection (4)(a), or to provide the services described in Subsection (4)(a)</u>
- within the division.
- 230 (c) The division and the board shall make the determination described in Subsection
- 231 (4)(b) based on an analysis of costs and benefits.
- 6. Page 9, Lines 254 through 257:
 - 254 (10) {-(a)} The division shall, on or before {-December 1, 2009} July 1, 2010 , implement the pilot
 - program on a statewide basis.
 - 256 { (b) The division may implement the pilot program on a statewide basis at anytime after
 - 257 <u>July 1, 2008, if the division and the board determine that the pilot program is successful.</u>}
- 7. *Page 9, Lines 263 through 265:*
 - 263 (2) \$650,000 { in nonlapsing funds } from the General Fund, for the fiscal year 2008-09
 - only, to the Division of Occupational and Professional Licensing to implement and operate the
 - pilot program described in this bill.
 - (3) The \$650,000 appropriated from the General Fund, under Subsection (2), shall be nonlapsing.
