LONG TITLE
General Description:
This bill modifies the Motor Vehicles Code by amending provisions relating to
motorcycle operator protective headgear requirements.
Highlighted Provisions:
This bill:
<ul> <li>provides that a person may not operate or ride on a motorcycle or motor-driven</li> </ul>
cycle on a highway in this state unless the person is wearing protective headgear if:
• another person under 21 years of age is also riding on the motorcycle or
motor-driven cycle;
• the operator of the motorcycle holds a motorcycle learner permit; or
• the motorcycle is being operated within the city limits of a city of the first,
second, or third class with an exception;
<ul> <li>provides that a person under 21 years of a age, rather than 18 years of age, may not</li> </ul>
operate or ride on a motorcycle or motor-driven cycle on a highway in this state
unless the person is wearing:
• protective headgear with a continuous solid chin bar; and
• protective glasses, goggles, or a transparent face shield unless the motorcycle or
motor-driven cycle is equipped with a protective windshield;
<ul> <li>grants the Department of Public Safety rulemaking authority to establish standards</li> </ul>
for approved protective headgear, glasses, goggles, or transparent face shields; and
