	WHEREAS, to sustain economic growth in the state and throughout the nation, it will		
	be necessary to invest resources in all forms of power generation, including traditional sources		
	such as coal, natural gas, and nuclear as well as renewable resources such as geothermal, wind,		
	and solar;		
	WHEREAS, the Utah Renewable Energy Zones Task Force Phase I Report indicates		
	that theoretical potential resources within Utah include 16,500 fifty megawatt solar renewable		
	energy zones, 51 wind renewable energy zones with a combined generating capacity of		
	approximately 9,145 megawatts, and a total of 2,166 megawatts of geothermal development		
	potential, the bulk of which is located in rural Utah;
