This bill:

<ul> <li>addresses the information and authorization required from an applicant for voter</li> </ul>
registration who uses the electronic system;
<ul> <li>authorizes the use of an applicant's signature obtained from driver license or</li> </ul>

- identification card records for voter registration purposes;authorizes the lieutenant governor to implement additional security measures in
  - connection with the electronic voter registration system;
  - ► requires the lieutenant governor to forward an applicant's materials to the appropriate county clerk for processing;
  - ► requires the Driver License Division to provide a digital copy of an applicant's driver license or identification card record to the lieutenant governor or county clerk; and
