Rep. Ray called the meeting to order at 8:09 a.m.

MOTION: Rep. Daw moved to approve the minutes of the February 27, 2009 meeting. The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Menlove absent for the vote.

H.B. 407 Regulation of Private Instruction Swimming Pools (*Rep. G. Hughes*)

This bill was not heard.

H.B. 419 Tanning Facilities Tax and Melanoma Cancer Research Fund (*Rep. M. Brown*)

Rep. Brown explained the bill, which was first heard and amended by the committee on February 25, 2009. MaryAnn Gerber, a volunteer for the Utah Cancer Action Network, and Michael Siler, Director of Government Relations, American Cancer Society, assisted in the presentation of the bill and addressed the committee.

1. Page 1, Lines 1 through 2:

2. *Page 1, Lines 9 through 11:*

9 General Description:

10 This bill amends the Revenue and Taxation portion of the Utah Code to provide
for a

3. *Page 1, Lines 18 through 20:*

18 ▶ creates the Melanoma Cancer ~~{-Research}~~ Education Fund and
provides that the Department of
19 Health shall use the fund to award grants to organizations for

20 melanoma cancer; and

4. *Page 3, Lines 83 through 86:*

83 Section 5. Section **59-28-105** is enacted to read:

84 59-28-105. Melanoma Cancer ~~{-Research}~~ Education Fund.

85 (1) There is created a restricted special revenue fund called the "Melanoma Cancer
86 ~~{-Research}~~ Education Fund."

5. *Page 4, Lines 98 through 99:*

98 (b) The Department of Health shall use the monies in the fund to award grants to
99 organizations for ~~{-research}~~ education related to melanoma cancer.

4. *Page 3, Lines 84 through 86:*

- 84 59-28-105. Melanoma Cancer Research and Education Fund.
85 (1) There is created a restricted special revenue fund called the "Melanoma Cancer
86 Research and Education Fund."

5. *Page 4, Lines 98 through 99:*

- 98 (b) The Department of Health shall use the monies in the fund to award grants to
99 organizations for research and education related to melanoma cancer.

The motion to amend the bill passed with Rep. Daw and Rep. Menlove voting in opposition to the motion.

MOTION: Rep. Vickers moved to pass H.B. 419 with a favorable recommendation.
