Vice-Chair Ipson called the meeting to order at 2:12 pm, and requested a motion to approve the minutes of January 28, 2009.

MOTION: Rep. Johnson moved to approve the minutes of January 28, 2009. The motion passed unanimously with Representatives Allen, Hutchings, and Wheatley absent for the vote.

HB0097 Sexual Exploitation of a Minor (Rep. R. Bigelow)

The sponsor indicated that as the bill had been introduced on January 28, 2009 that he would appreciate the consideration of the committee in adopting an amendment.

MOTION: Madam Chair Fowlke moved to amend:

- 1. Page 1, Line 13:
 - 13 child pornography <u>; and</u>
 - provides that entities, their employees, and law enforcement officers who are acting in good faith to investigate, monitor for, or report child pornography are not considered to have violated any civil or criminal

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provision regarding sexual exploitation of a minor

- 2. Page 1, Line 26 through Page 2, Line 28:
 - 26 (a) when the person $\underline{:}$
 - (i) knowingly produces, { distributes, views, } possesses, or possesses
 - 27 with intent to distribute {-, } <u>child pornography</u>; <u>or</u> (ii) intentionally distributes or views child pornography; or
 - 28 (b) if the person is a minor's parent or legal guardian and knowingly consents to or
- 3. Page 2, Line 38:
 - 38 the visual depiction.

(5) This section may not be construed to impose criminal or civil liability on:
(a) any entity or an employee, director, officer, or agent of an entity when acting within the scope of employment, for the good faith performance of:

(i) reporting or data preservation duties required under any federal or state law;

<u>or</u>

<u>(ii) implementing a policy of attempting to prevent the presence of child</u> <u>pornography on any tangible or intangible property, or of detecting and reporting the</u> <u>presence of child pornography on the property; or</u>

(b) any law enforcement officer acting within the scope of a criminal investigation.

The motion passed unanimously with Representatives Allen, Hutchings, and Wheatley absent for the vote.

Mark Shurtleff, Utah Attorney General, spoke in favor of the bill and addressed questions from the committee. Paul Rogers, representing Internet Service Providers, and Ken Wallentine, Chief, Investigations, Attorney General's Office spoke in favor of the bill.

MOTION: Madam Chair Fowlke moved to pass the bill out favorably as amended. The motion passed unanimously with Representative Wheatley absent for the vote.

HB0223 Statute of Limitations Amendments (Rep. C. Wimmer)

The sponsor introduced the bill and explained its intent.

Darlene Schmidt, a citizen, spoke to the bill.

MOTION: Representative Hutchings moved to pass the bill out favorably. The motion

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passed unanimously.

HB0233 Aggravated Sexual Assault Amendments (Rep. C. Wimmer)

The sponsor introduced the bill and explained its intent.

Paul Boyden, Executive Director, Statewide Association of Prosecutors, assisted with the presentation of the bill.

Thomas Vaughn, Legislative Research and General Counsel, explained the bill and answered questions without speaking for or against the bill.

Darlene Schmidt, a citizen, spoke against the bill.

MOTION: Representative McIff moved to pass the bill out favorably. The motion passed unanimously

HB0072 Children's Justice Center Amendments (Rep. L. Fowlke)
