Rep. Ray called the meeting to order at 8:10 a.m.

MOTION: Rep. Daw moved to approve the minutes of the January 26, 2010 meeting. The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Sandstrom absent for the vote.

H.B. 88 Electronic Cigarette Restrictions (*Rep. R. Menlove*)

Rep. Menlove explained the bill to the committee, assisted by Amy Sands, Department of Health. Handouts were distributed to the committee.

H.B. 71 Nicotine Product Restrictions (*Rep. P. Ray*)

MOTION: Rep. Ray moved to adopt 1st Substitute H.B. 71, Nicotine Product and Flavored Smokeless Tobacco Restrictions. The motion passed unanimously with Rep. Daw absent for the vote.

Rep. Ray explained the substitute bill to the committee.

H.B. 225 Counterfeit Substance Amendments (*Rep. P. Ray*)

Rep. Ray introduced the bill and asked Paul Boyden, Statewide Association of Prosecutors, to explain the bill.

MOTION: Rep. Daw moved to pass H.B. 225 with a favorable recommendation. The motion passed unanimously.

H.B. 200 Informed Consent Amendments (*Rep. C. Wimmer*)

MOTION: Rep. Sandstrom moved to amend the bill as follows:

1. Page 5, Lines 129 through 130:

129 worker, or certified social worker ~~{-has-}~~ orally, in a face-to-face consultation,
[informed] informs
130 the pregnant woman that:

2. Page 5, Lines 139 through 141:

139 (ii) the printed material and a viewing of or a copy of the informational video ~~{-}~~
140 ~~—(A) shall be provided to her free of charge; and~~
141 ~~—(B) is also available-}~~ shall be made available to her, free of charge, on the
Department of Health's website;

3. Page 7, Lines 188 through 189:

188 (ii) if the woman chooses not to ~~[do so,]~~ view the video at a time described in
189 Subsection (4)(a), ~~{-give a copy of the video-}~~ [shall be provided to her] ~~{-to the~~
woman-} inform the woman that she can access the video on the Department of
Health's website .

4. Page 8, Lines 236 through 238:

236 (10) (a) The Department of Health ~~{-and local health departments-}~~ shall
provide an
237 ultrasound, in accordance with the provisions of Subsection (2)(b), at no expense to the
238 pregnant woman.
(b) A local health department shall refer a person who requests an ultrasound
described in Subsection (10)(a) to the Department of Health.

5. Page 13, Lines 370 through 371:

370 (a) the total amount of informed consent material described in this section that was
371 distributed or accessed ;

The motion to amend the bill passed unanimously.

Rep. Wimmer explained the bill to the committee.

Spoke in favor of the bill: Dalane England, Utah Eagle Forum

MOTION: Rep. Daw moved to pass the amended bill with a favorable recommendation. The motion passed unanimously.

H.B. 232 Medical Language Interpreter Amendments (*Rep. R. Chavez-Houck*)
