Rep. Barrus called the meeting to order at 8:04 a.m.

**MOTION:** Rep. Barrus moved to approve the minutes of the February 12, 2010 meeting.

### H.B. 231 Water Rights Priorities in Times of Shortage (Rep. K. Gibson)

Rep. Gibson explained the bill to the committee, assisted by Kent Jones, State Engineer, Division of Water Rights.

## H.B. 107 Animal Shelter Amendments (Rep. J. Seelig)

### H.B. 102 Agriculture Sustainability Act (Rep. J. Draxler)

Rep. Draxler explained the bill to the committee, assisted by Leonard Blackman, Commissioner, Utah Department of Agriculture and Jody Hoffman, Policy Analyst, Utah Cities and Towns

**MOTION:** Rep. Mathis moved to adjourn. The motion passed with Rep. Draxler, Rep. Gibson and Rep. Hendrickson voting in opposition to the motion.
