LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill amends provisions of the Utah Controlled Substances Act.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

- ▶ requires a ~~{medical practitioner}~~ prescriber applying for a new or renewed controlled substance license to take four hours of ~~{opioid}~~ controlled substance prescribing classes each licensing period;
- ▶ requires the Division of Occupations and Professional Licensing, in consultation with the Utah Medical Association and other medical licensing boards, to establish educational content of ~~{an opioid}~~ controlled substance prescribing ~~{class}~~ classes to help establish safe and effective practices for prescribing controlled substances, hypnotic depressants, and psychostimulants;

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- ▶ provides that any ~~{opioid}~~controlled substance prescribing class required under this bill does not increase the total continuing medical education requirements of a ~~{practitioner}~~prescriber obtaining; and
- ▶ allows the division to establish rules.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section **58-37-6.5** is enacted to read:

58-37-6.5. Continuing ~~{medical}~~professional education for ~~{practitioners}~~

~~———— (1) (a) Beginning with the 2012-2014 license renewal cycle}~~**controlled substance prescribers.**

(1) Beginning on July 1, 2012, each individual, other than a veterinarian, who has a license to prescribe a controlled substance under Title 58, Chapter 37, Utah Controlled Substances Act, shall complete at least four continuing ~~{medical}~~professional education hours in approved ~~{opioid prescribing}~~controlled substance classes per licensing period.

~~{———— (b) Beginning on January 1, 2013, each individual, other than a veterinarian, applying for an initial license to prescribe a controlled substance under Title 58, Chapter 37, Utah Controlled Substances Act, shall comply with the continuing medical education requirement established in Subsection (1)(a):~~

~~{~~ ~~(c)}~~(b) Any ~~{opioid}~~controlled substance prescribing class under this section shall:

(i) qualify for the AMA PRA Category 1 Credit;

(ii) be presented by an organization accredited to provide continuing medical education

by:

(A) the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education;

(B) the Utah Medical Association; or

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(C) another recognized state continuing medical education accrediting body; and

(iii) be approved by:

(A) the recognized state continuing medical education accrediting body; and

(B) the division.

(2) The division, by rule and in consultation with the applicable practitioner licensing board and the recognized state continuing medical education accrediting body, shall establish educational content for any ~~opioid~~ controlled substance prescribing class under this section.

The content shall include:

(a) the scope of controlled substance prescribing problem;

(b) abuse, dependence, and addictive properties and toxicity of controlled substances;

(c) use of state controlled substance database;

(d) specific pharmacology;

(e) screening for risk;

(f) monitoring compliance;

(g) prevention strategies;

(h) early and late interventions and treatment;

(i) state controlled substances guidelines; and

(j) patient education on controlled substances, such as opioid analgesics,

sedative/hypnotic depressants, and psychostimulants, and dangers and appropriate uses of controlled substances.

(3) ~~An opioid~~ A controlled substance prescribing class required under this section:

(a) may be held:

(i) in conjunction with other continuing medical education programs; and

(ii) online;

(b) does not increase the total number of states required continuing medical education hours required for a ~~practitioner~~ prescriber; and

(c) shall be reported by an individual as part of the continuing medical education required for licensing.

(3) The division may establish rules, in accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act, to implement this section.
