H.B. 10 *Renewal of Judgment Act (Rep. G. Froerer)*

Rep. Froerer explained the bill to the committee with the assistance of Kirk Cullimore, Attorney,

MOTION: Rep. Brown moved to pass the bill with a favorable recommendation. The motion passed with Rep. Christensen voting in opposition.

H.B. 48 *Fingerprints of Juveniles (Rep. J. Peterson)*

This bill was not heard.

H.B. 52 *Limitation of Actions - Criminal Offenses (Rep. B. Wilson)*

Rep. Wilson explained the bill to the committee with the assistance of Vincent Meister, Deputy District Attorney.

Mr. Kent Morgan, Utah Association Defense Lawyers, spoke against the bill.

MOTION: Rep. Gibson moved to pass the bill with a favorable recommendation. The motion passed with Rep. Hutchings, Rep. King and Rep. Wheatley voting in

opposition. Rep. Herrod and Rep. Ray were absent for the vote.

H.B. 56 Expungement Amendments (*Rep. Julie Fisher*)

Rep. Fisher explained the bill to the committee with the assistance of Lana Taylor, Attorney General's Office.

MOTION: Rep. Ivory moved to pass the bill with a favorable recommendation. The motion passed unanimously with Rep. King absent for the vote.

H.B. 205 Domestic Violence and Dating Violence Amendments (*Rep. P. Ray*)

Rep. Ray explained the bill to the committee with the assistance of Stewart Ralphs, Executive Director, Legal Aid Society of Salt Lake.

Mr. Dan Deuel, citizen, spoke against the bill.

The Chair requested to move to the next item on the agenda.

H.B. 207 Juvenile Amendments (*Rep. W. Harper*)

Rep. Harper presented 1st Sub. H.B. 207, Juvenile Amendments (*Rep. W. Harper*).
