Approval of Minutes

MOTION: Sen. Reid moved to approve the minutes of January 27, 2011.

The motion passed unanimously with Sen. Christensen, Sen. Jones, and Sen. Robles absent for the vote.

1. SB0137 - Medicaid Amendments (A. Christensen)

The bill was not considered.

2. HB0217 - Appointment of Director of the Division of Health Care Financing (D. Clark)

Rep. Clark presented the bill.

MOTION: Sen. Christensen moved to pass H.B. 217 out of committee with a favorable

recommendation.

The motion passed unanimously with Sen. Jones and Sen. Robles absent for the vote.

3. SB0048 - Alzheimer's State Plan Task Force (K. Morgan)

Sen. Morgan presented the bill.

Mr. Zullo spoke in favor of the bill.

MOTION: Sen. Jones moved to pass S.B.48 out of committee with a favorable recommendation.

The motion passed unanimously.

4. SB0124 - Leaving a Child Unattended in a Motor Vehicle (B. McAdams)

Sen. McAdams presented the bill.

MOTION: Sen. Jones moved to amend the bill as follows:

- 1. Page 1, Lines 9 through 10:
 - 9 This bill amends the Utah Criminal Code by making it an infraction to leave a child
 - 10 unattended in <u>an enclosed compartment of</u> a motor vehicle.
- 2. Page 1, Line 16:
 - 16 leave a child in <u>an enclosed compartment of</u> a motor vehicle if:
- *3. Page 1, Lines 20 through 22:*
 - provides that this bill does not apply if the person's conduct that constitutes a
 - 21 violation of this bill is { punishable as a class B misdemeanor, a class A
 - 22 misdemeanor, or a felony. subject to a greater penalty under another provision of state law.
- 4. Page 2, Lines 34 through 47:
 - 34 (1) As used in this section:
 - 35 (a) "Child" means a person who is younger than nine years old.
 - (b) "Enclosed compartment" means any enclosed area of a motor vehicle, including the passenger compartment, regardless of whether a door, window, or hatch is left open.
 - 36 (c) "Motor vehicle" means an automobile, truck, truck tractor, bus, or

any other 37 self-propelled vehicle. 38 (2) A person who is responsible for a child is guilty of a class C misdemeanor if: 39 (a) the person intentionally, recklessly, knowingly, or with criminal negligence leaves an enclosed compartment of a motor vehicle; 40 the child in $\{\frac{a}{a}\}$ (b) the child is not supervised by a person who is at least 12 years old; and 41 42 (c) (i) the conditions present a risk to the child's health or safety; 43 (ii) the engine of the motor vehicle is running; or 44 (iii) the keys to the motor vehicle are in the passenger compartment of the motor 45 vehicle. (3) This section does not apply if the person's conduct that constitutes a violation of 46 47 this section is { punishable as a class B misdemeanor, a class A misdemeanor, or a felony } subject to a greater penalty under another provision of state law ______

The motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Rushton, and Mr. Robinson spoke in favor of the bill.

MOTION: Sen. Madsen moved to amend the bill as follows:

- 1. *Page 1, Lines 18 through 19:*
 - the conditions present a risk to the child's health or safety {, the engine is running,
 - 19 or the keys are in the passenger compartment of the motor vehicle ; and
- 2. *Page 2, Lines 42 through 45:*
 - 42 (c) {(i)} the conditions present a risk to the child's health or safety {\div}
 - 43 { (ii) the engine of the motor vehicle is running; or
 - 44 (iii) the keys to the motor vehicle are in the passenger compartment of the motor
 - 45 <u>vehicle.</u>}

The motion passed unanimously with Sen. Jones absent for the vote.

Ms. Christensen and Dr. Metcalf spoke to the bill.

MOTION: Sen. Jones moved to pass S.B. 124, as amended, out of committee with a favorable recommendation.

The motion passed with Sen. Buttars voting in opposition.

4. HB0014 - Catastrophic Mental Health Coverage - Sunset Act (J. Dunnigan)

This bill was not considered.

5. HB0015 - Controlled Substance Database - Licensing Amendments (B. Daw)

Rep. Daw presented the bill.

MOTION: Sen. Christensen moved to pass H.B. 15 out of committee with a favorable recommendation.

The motion passed unanimously.

6. HB0215 - Fatality Review Act Amendments (M. Newbold)

Rep. Newbold presented the bill.

MOTION: Sen. Christensen moved to pass H.B. 215 out of committee with a favorable recommendation.

The motion passed unanimously with Sen. Madsen absent for the vote.

7. HB0023 - Controlled Substance Modifications (G. Froerer)

Sen. Christensen and Mr. Boyden presented the bill.

Ms. Mill spoke in favor of the bill.

MOTION: Sen. Robles moved to pass H.B. 23 out of committee with a favorable recommendation.

The motion passed unanimously with Sen. Madsen and Sen. Jones absent for the vote.

MOTION: Sen. Robles moved to adjourn.

The motion passed unanimously.
