182           The following entities may offer online courses to eligible students through the

185   Electronic High School Act;

186           (2) beginning with the 2011-12 school year, a charter school or district school created exclusively  
187   for the purpose of serving  
188   students online; and

189           (3) beginning with the 2011-12 school year, an LEA program, approved by the LEA's governing  
190   board, that is created  
191   exclusively for the purpose of serving students online.

5. Page 11, Line 326 through Page 12, Line 338:

326           The Education Interim Committee shall study and make recommendations for proposed  
327   legislation in the 2012 General Session on the Statewide Online Education Program, including:

337 prepare the student for postsecondary education and a career; and

6. *Page 12, Line 358:*

358 This bill takes effect on July 1, 2011 {-} except the amendments to Sections 53A-15-1002 and

53A-15-1006 take effect on July 1, 2012.
