	Section 1. Section 53A-17a-124.8 is enacted to read:
	53A-17a-124.8. Definitions.
	For purposes of Sections 53A-17a-124.8 and 53A-17a-124.9:
	(1) (a) "Front-line teacher" means a licensed teacher who has an assignment to teach a
<u>k</u>	cindergarten, elementary, secondary, or special education course.
	(b) "Front-line teacher" does not include a prekindergarten teacher, a school-based
<u>S</u>	pecialist, or a classroom aide.
	(2) "LEA compensation percentage" means the amount of money from an LEA's
