LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill requires ~~{the reporting of federal receipts by a}~~ certain political ~~{subdivision and requires the report to contain a plan to operate}~~ subdivisions to develop a contingency plan if there is a reduction of federal funds or receipts to the political subdivision ~~{ in the event federal receipts are reduced by 5% and 25% or more}~~.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

- ▶ defines terms; and
- ▶ requires ~~{a political subdivision to prepare and submit a report to the Division of Finance on federal receipts received by the political subdivision;~~

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- requires the report to contain a plan to operate the state agency in the event federal receipts are reduced by 5% and 25% or more;
- requires the Division of Finance to report to the Executive Appropriations Committee on the reports the political subdivisions are required to make to the Division of Finance;
- provides procedures for requiring the Executive Appropriations Committee to review the Division of Finance report; and
- provides that the Executive Appropriations Committee may make certain recommendations, including a reduction or elimination of appropriations to } certain political subdivisions to develop a contingency plan if there is a reduction of federal funds or receipts to the political subdivision.

Section 1. Section **11-49-101** is enacted to read:

CHAPTER 49. FEDERAL RECEIPTS ~~{REPORTING}~~PLANNING REQUIREMENTS

11-49-101. Title.

This chapter is known as "Federal Receipts ~~{Reporting}~~Planning Requirements."

Section 2. Section **11-49-102** is enacted to read:

11-49-102. Definitions.

As used in this chapter:

(1) "Federal receipts" means the federal financial assistance, as defined in 31 U.S.C. ~~{~~Sec. ~~{~~ 7501, that is reported as part of a single audit.

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(2) "Political subdivision" means a county, a municipality, a local district, a special service district, an entity created by an interlocal agreement adopted under Title 11, Chapter 13, Interlocal Cooperation Act, or a community development and renewal agency created under Title 17C, Limited Purpose Local Government Entities - Community Development and Renewal Agencies Act.

(3) "Single audit" is as defined in 31 U.S.C. ~~§~~Sec. ~~§~~ 7501.

Section 3. Section 11-49-103 is enacted to read:

11-49-103. Federal receipts ~~reporting~~planning requirements.

~~§(1) Subject to Subsection (2) and except as provided in Subsection (3), a political subdivision shall each year, on or before September 30, prepare a report that:~~

~~—— (a) reports the aggregate value of federal receipts the; If a political subdivision received for the preceding fiscal year;~~

~~—— (b) reports the aggregate amount of federal funds appropriated by the Legislature to the political subdivision for the preceding fiscal year;~~

~~—— (c) calculates the percentage; receives federal funds or federal receipts that comprise 10% or more of the political subdivision's total budget for the preceding fiscal year that constitutes federal receipts that; annual budget, the political subdivision received for that fiscal year; and~~

~~———— (5) The Division of Finance shall submit the report required by Subsection (4) to the Executive Appropriations Committee on or before November 1 of each year:~~

~~———— (6) Upon receipt of the report required by Subsection (4), the chairs of the Executive Appropriations Committee shall place the report on the agenda for review and consideration at the next Executive Appropriations Committee meeting:~~

~~———— (7) When considering the report required by Subsection (4), the Executive Appropriations Committee may elect to:~~

~~———— (a) recommend that the Legislature reduce or eliminate appropriations for a political subdivision;~~
