1	This bill modifies the Uniform Driver License Act by creating an emergency contact
2	database for driver license and identification card holders.
3	Highlighted Provisions:
4	This bill:
5	 requires the Driver License Division to create an emergency contact database for
6	license certificate and identification card holders;
7	 provides that a law enforcement officer may share information contained in the
8	emergency contact database with other public safety workers on the scene of a
9	motor vehicle accident or other emergency situation;
0.0	 provides that a person holding a license certificate or identification card may
1	provide the Driver License Division the names, addresses, and telephone numbers
2	of no more than two emergency contact persons;
3	 requires the Driver License Division to make rules establishing the procedures to
4	implement the emergency contact database;
5	 provides that if a person is involved in a motor vehicle accident or other emergency
6	situation and is unable to communicate with the contact person or persons specified

in the database, a law enforcement officer shall make a good faith effort to notify



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the contact person or persons of the situation; and	
 specifies that the Driver License Division, a law enforcement officer, or a law 	
enforcement agency that employs a law enforcement officer does not incur liability	
in connection with the use of the emergency contact database in certain	
circumstances.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:	
Section 1. Section 53-3-205.6 is enacted to read:	
53-3-205.6. Emergency contact database.	
(1) (a) The division shall establish a database of the emergency contacts of a person	
who holds a license certificate, learner permit, identification card, or any other type license or	
permit issued under this chapter.	
(b) Information in the database created under this section may only be accessed by:	
(i) employees of the division;	
(ii) law enforcement officers employed by a law enforcement agency; and	
(iii) employees or authorized agents of a law enforcement agency.	
(c) A law enforcement officer may share information contained in the emergency	
contact database with other public safety workers on the scene of a motor vehicle accident or	
other emergency situation, as needed to conduct official law enforcement duties.	
(2) A person holding a license certificate, learner permit, identification card, or any	
other type of license or permit issued under this chapter may provide the division, in a manner	
specified by the division, the name, address, telephone number, and relationship to the holder	
of no more than two emergency contact persons whom the holder wishes to be contacted by a	
law enforcement officer if the holder:	

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(a) is involved in a motor vehicle accident or other emergency situation; and	

59	(a) is involved in a motor vehicle accident or other emergency situation; and
60	(b) is unable to communicate with the contact person or persons.
61	(3) In accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act, the
62	division shall make rules establishing the procedures to implement this section including:
63	(a) specifying the method for a license certificate, instruction permit, or identification
64	card holder to provide the division with emergency contact information;
65	(b) specifying the method for a license certificate, learner permit, or identification card
66	holder to change the emergency contact information; and
67	(c) other rules required for the implementation of the database or its operation that the
68	division determines necessary to implement the provisions of this section.
69	(4) (a) If a person involved in a motor vehicle accident or other emergency situation is
70	unable to communicate with the contact person or persons specified in the database, a law
71	enforcement officer shall make a good faith effort to notify the contact person or persons of the
72	situation.
73	(b) A law enforcement officer or a law enforcement agency that employs a law
74	enforcement officer may not incur any liability if the law enforcement officer is not able to
75	make contact with a designated emergency contact person.
76	(c) Except for willful or wanton misconduct, a law enforcement officer or a law
77	enforcement agency that employs a law enforcement officer may not incur any liability relating
78	to the reporting or use of the database during a motor vehicle accident or other emergency
79	situation.
80	(5) The division is not liable for any damages, costs, or expenses arising or resulting
81	from any inaccurate or incomplete data or system unavailability.
