This bill:

complete more than 1/2 hour of education per licensing period on the appropriate
management of chronic pain;
<ul> <li>provides that the education counts toward continuing professional education on</li> </ul>
controlled substances prescribing;
<ul> <li>amends the effective date for controlled substances prescriber education</li> </ul>
requirements;
<ul> <li>exempts optometrists and naturopathic physicians from controlled substances</li> </ul>
prescriber education requirements; and
<ul><li>makes technical changes.</li></ul>

85	(1) (a) (i) [Beginning on July 1, 2012, each] Except as provided in Subsection
86	(1)(a)(ii), beginning January 1, 2013, an individual[, other than a veterinarian,] who has a
87	license to prescribe a controlled substance under Title 58, Chapter 37, Utah Controlled
88	Substances Act, shall complete at least four continuing professional education hours in
89	approved controlled substance prescribing classes per licensing period.

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90	(ii) Subsection (1)(a)(i) does not apply to:
91	(A) an optometrist licensed under Title 58, Chapter 16a, Utah Optometry Practice Act;
92	(B) a veterinarian licensed under Title 58, Chapter 28, Veterinary Practice Act; or
93	(C) a naturopathic physician licensed under Title 58, Chapter 71, Naturopathic
94	Physician Practice Act.
95	(b) $[Any]$ $\underline{A}$ controlled substance prescribing class under this section shall:
