WHEREAS, hydraulic fracturing, a mechanical method of increasing the permeability
of rock, thus increasing the amount of oil or gas produced from the rock, has greatly enhanced
oil and gas production in Utah;
WHEREAS, oil and gas production increases have led to growth in employment and
economic development as well as promotion of energy independence for the United States;
WHEREAS, the state of Utah, through the Division of Oil, Gas, and Mining and the

Department of Environmental Quality, have proven more than capable of regulating oil and gas

29	WHEREAS, the state is best situated to closely monitor oil and gas drilling and
30	fracturing operations to ensure that they are conducted in an environmentally sound manner:

32	Governor concurring therein, urges the Congress of the United States to clearly delegate
