## Mr. President:

The Education Committee reports a favorable recommendation on **S.B. 284**, CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT AMENDMENTS, by Senator S. Urquhart, with the following amendments:

- 1. Page 1, Lines 12 through 15:
  - authorizes a student to be charged a per credit hour partial tuition for <a href="mailto:certain">certain</a> higher
  - education courses offered in public schools through concurrent enrollment;
  - requires that concurrent enrollment courses:
  - { meet general education requirements } be introductory-level courses at higher education institutions; and
- 2. *Page 1, Lines 18 through 19:* 
  - requires the State Board of Regents { and the State Board of Education to work
  - 19 <u>collaboratively to offer</u>} <u>to develop</u> certain technology-intensive concurrent enrollment courses;
- 3. Page 3, Lines 83 through 88:
  - 83 (4) (a) Concurrent enrollment courses shall be <u>introductory-level general</u>

    <u>education, career and technical education, or pre-major</u> <u>college-level courses</u>

  - 84 the first or second year of general education at a state institution of higher education

- 86 (b) The State Board of Regents { and the State Board of Education } shall :
  - (i) develop
- 87 technology-intensive concurrent enrollment courses, designed as hybrid courses, having a
- 88 blend of different learning activities available both in classrooms and online ; and
  - (ii) develop courses delivered exclusively online .
  - 4. Page 5, Lines 124 through 126:
    - 124 (ii) except as provided in Subsection (9)(f), partial tuition of up to \$30 per credit hour for each concurrent enrollment course for
    - which the student receives college credit, paid directly to the institution of higher education
    - that offers the credit.
  - 5. Page 5, Line 132:
    - receive credit from an institution of higher education.
  - <u>(f) A state institution of higher education may not charge tuition to a high school</u> concurrent enrollment student for:
  - (i) a technology-intensive concurrent enrollment course described in Subsection (4)(b); or
  - (ii) a gateway career and technology education course, as defined by the State Board of Regents.
