H.B. 385 Sales and Use Tax - Seller Notice Requirements (*Rep. W. Harper*)

 - 58 (3) The notice required by this section shall state that the:
 - 59 (a) noncollecting seller did not collect a sales or use tax on the sale; and

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- 60 (b) {-sale may be subject to sales or use taxation;
- 61 <u>(c) sale is not exempt from sales or use taxation because it is made over the</u> Internet or
- 62 <u>by other remote means; and</u>
- 63 (d) purchaser should consult the tax laws of the state in which the sale is made to
- 64 determine whether the sale is subject to sales or use taxation.
