MOTION Rep. Arent moved to approve the minutes of the February 8, 2012 meeting. The motion passed unanimously, with Rep. Frank, Rep. Grover, Rep. Hughes, Rep. Seelig, and Rep. Wright absent for the vote.

H.B. 140 Vehicle Checkpoint Amendments (Rep. D. Butterfield)

Rep. Butterfield introduced and explained the bill to the committee. (handout)

S.B. 147 Emergency Vehicle Amendments (Sen. D. Thatcher)

Sen. Thatcher explained and introduced the bill to the committee with the assistance of Sheriff Jim Winder, Salt Lake County Sheriff.

MOTION: Rep. Perry moved to pass the bill out favorably. The motion passed unanimously, with Rep. Ipson absent for the vote.

H.B. 194 Involuntary Feeding and Hydration of Inmates (Rep. D. Brown)

Rep. Brown introduced and explained the bill to the committee.

MOTION: Rep. Litvack moved to adopt 1st Substitute H.B. 194. The motion passed unanimously, with Rep. Grover, Rep. Hughes, and Rep. Ipson absent for the vote.

MOTION: Rep. Perry moved to amend the bill as follows:

1. Page 4, Line 89:

89 the subject prisoner {~~—~~} , and shall explain what efforts have been made to address the findings of the evaluation including provision of medication or other treatment.

2. Page 4, Line 93:

93 are available , including the evaluation referenced in this section ;
