Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section **53A-17a-124.5** is amended to read:

53A-17a-124.5. Appropriation for class size reduction.

- (1) Money appropriated to the State Board of Education for class size reduction shall be used to reduce the average class size in kindergarten through the eighth grade in the state's public schools.
- (2) Each district <u>or charter school</u> shall receive its allocation based upon prior year average daily membership in kindergarten through grade [eight] <u>8</u> plus growth as determined under Subsection 53A-17a-106(3) as compared to the [state] total <u>prior year average daily membership in kindergarten through grade 8 plus growth of school districts and charter schools that qualify for an allocation pursuant to Subsection (8).</u>
- (3) (a) A district may use its allocation to reduce class size in any one or all of the grades referred to under this section, except as otherwise provided in Subsection (3)(b).
- (b) (i) Each district or charter school shall use 50% of its allocation to reduce class size in any one or all of grades kindergarten through grade [$\frac{1}{2}$, with an emphasis on improving student reading skills.
- (ii) If a district's <u>or charter school's</u> average class size is below 18 in grades kindergarten through [two] grade 2, it may petition the state board for, and the state board may grant, a waiver to use its allocation under Subsection (3)(b)(i) for class size reduction in the other grades.
- (4) Schools may use nontraditional innovative and creative methods to reduce class sizes with this appropriation and may use part of their allocation to focus on class size reduction for specific groups, such as at risk students, or for specific blocks of time during the school day.
- (5) (a) A school district <u>or charter school</u> may use up to 20% of its allocation under Subsection (1) for capital facilities projects if such projects would help to reduce class size.
- (b) If a school district's <u>or charter school's</u> student population increases by 5% or 700 students from the previous school year, the school district <u>or charter school</u> may use up to 50% of any allocation it receives under this section for classroom construction.
 - (6) This appropriation is to supplement any other appropriation made for class size
