9	This bill modifies the Uniform Driver License Act by authorizing the issuance of a

15	United States citizen, permanent resident alien, or United States national] person obtains the
15a	required documentation to establish verification of certain information $\leftarrow \hat{H}$;
16	 provides that a temporary regular identification card shall be recognized and grant
17	the person the same privileges as a regular identification card;
18	 provides that a temporary regular identification card issued is invalid:
19	• when the person's regular identification card has been issued;
20	• when, for good cause, an applicant's application for an identification card has
21	been refused; or
22	• upon expiration of the temporary regular identification card; and
23	 makes technical corrections.

	(v) a photograph or other facsimile of the person's signature;

	(3) At the applicant's request, the card may include a statement that the applicant has a
9	special medical problem or allergies to certain drugs, for the purpose of medical treatment.
