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## LONG TITLE

## **General Description:**

This bill amends the Utah Health Code and directs the Department of Health to establish a public education program regarding the dangers of congenital cytomegalovirus (CMV) and the methods of prevention of CMV.

## **Highlighted Provisions:**

- This bill:
  - ▶ directs the Department of Health to create a public education program to inform pregnant women and women who may become pregnant about the occurrence of CMV, the transmission of CMV, the birth defects that CMV can cause, methods of diagnosis, and available preventative measures;
    - requires the Department of Health to provide this information to:
      - licensed child care programs and their employees;
    - health care facilities licensed pursuant to Title 26, Chapter 21, Health Care
- 21 Facility Licensing and Inspection Act;
- child care programs administered by educational institutions regulated by the
- boards of education of this state, private education institutions that provide
- 24 education in lieu of that provided by the public education system, or by
- 25 parochial education institutions;
- child care programs administered by public or private institutions of higher
- education, if the care is provided in connection with a course of study or



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28	program, relating to the education or study of children, that is provided to students of the
29	institution of higher education;

31	the public schools if the care is provided under contract with the public schools
32	or on school properties or if the public schools accept responsibility and

35	under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code or that are provided
36	pursuant to a written agreement with a municipality or county;

38	by the Department of Human Services; and
39	<ul> <li>religious, ecclesiastical, or denominational organizations offering children's</li> </ul>

52	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
53	Section 1. Section <b>26-10-10</b> is enacted to read:
54	26-10-10. Cytomegalovirus (CMV) public education.
55	(1) As used in this section "CMV" means cytomegalovirus.
56	(2) The department shall establish and conduct a public education program to inform
57	pregnant women and women who may become pregnant regarding:
58	(a) the incidence of CMV:

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59	(b) the transmission of CMV to pregnant women and women who may become
60	pregnant;
61	(c) birth defects caused by congenital CMV;
62	(d) methods of diagnosing congenital CMV; and
63	(e) available preventative measures.
64	(3) The department shall provide the information described in Subsection (2) to:
65	(a) child care programs licensed under Title 26, Chapter 39, Utah Child Care Licensing
66	Act, and their employees;
67	(b) a person described in Subsection 26-39-403(1)(c), (f), (g), (h), (j), or (k); and
68	(c) religious, ecclesiastical, or denominational organizations offering children's
69	programs as a part of worship services.
70	(4) If tests for hearing loss under Subsection 26-10-6(1) issued to a newborn infant
71	between two and five days of age and between seven and 28 days of age both indicate hearing
72	loss, a medical practitioner shall:
73	(a) test the newborn infant for CMV; and
74	(b) provide to the parents of the newborn infant information regarding:
75	(i) birth defects caused by congenital CMV; and
76	(ii) available methods of treatment.
