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| 28 | (3) The commission shall consist of 17 members appointed as follows:                        |
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| 29 | (a) two members of the Senate appointed by the president of the Senate;                     |
| 30 | (b) two members of the House of Representatives appointed by the speaker of the             |
| 31 | House of Representatives:   |
| 32 | (c) six representatives from marriage and family departments at state institutions of       |
| 33 | higher education, as defined in Section 53B-3-102, appointed by the governor;               |
