- (e) Each person seeking the office of lieutenant governor, the office of district attorney, or the office of President or Vice President of the United States shall comply with the specific declaration of candidacy requirements established by this section.
- (2) (a) Each person intending to become a candidate for the office of district attorney within a multicounty prosecution district that is to be filled at the next regular general election shall:
- (i) file a declaration of candidacy with the clerk designated in the interlocal agreement creating the prosecution district on or after the second Friday in March and before 5 p.m. on the third Thursday in March before the next regular general election; and
  - (ii) pay the filing fee.
- (b) The designated clerk shall provide to the county clerk of each county in the prosecution district a certified copy of each declaration of candidacy filed for the office of district attorney.
- (3) (a)  $\hat{H} \rightarrow [f]$  Within five working days of nomination, each lieutenant governor candidate [f]
- [Each person seeking to become a candidate for  $\hat{H} \rightarrow \underline{the} \leftarrow \hat{H}$  office of lieutenant governor]  $\leftarrow \hat{H}$  shall:
- (i) file a declaration of candidacy with the lieutenant governor Ĥ→ [on or after the second Friday in March and before the] [Friday immediately before the convention at which the lieutenant governor candidate is nominated] earlier of:
- (A) the last business day before the day on which the person's political party conducts a convention or, as it relates to a political party that does not hold a convention, the last business day before the day on which the person's political party engages in the selection procedure described in Subsection 20A-8-401(2)(c); or
- (B) the Friday immediately before the third Saturday in April of an even-numbered  $\underbrace{\text{year}}$   $\leftarrow$   $\hat{H}$  ; and
  - (ii) pay the filing fee.
- (b) (i) Any candidate for lieutenant governor who fails to file  $\hat{\mathbf{H}} \rightarrow [f]$  within five working days [f] [as provided in Subsection (3)(a)]  $\leftarrow \hat{\mathbf{H}}$  is disqualified.
- (ii) If a lieutenant governor is disqualified, another candidate shall be nominated to replace the disqualified candidate  $\hat{\mathbf{H}} \rightarrow [\frac{\text{as provided in Section 20A-1-501}}{\text{constant 20A-1-501}}] \leftarrow \hat{\mathbf{H}}$ .
  - (4) Each registered political party shall:
- (a) certify the names of its candidates for President and Vice President of the United States to the lieutenant governor no later than August 31; or
- (b) provide written authorization for the lieutenant governor to accept the certification of candidates for President and Vice President of the United States from the national office of
