(1) The State Board of Education shall prepare an annual school plant capital outlay
report of all school districts, which includes information on the number and size of building
projects completed and under construction.
(2) A school district or charter school shall prepare and submit an annual school plant
capital outlay report in accordance with Section 63A-3-402.

information available on the Internet for participating state entities' and participating local
entities, using the Utah Public Finance Website; and

financial information as required by this part and by rule under Section 63A-3-404;
(b) allow a person who has Internet access to use the website without paying a fee;
