0	Section 1. Section 53A-20-104.5 is amended to read:
1	53A-20-104.5. School building construction and inspection manual Annual
2	construction and inspection conference Verification of school construction inspections.
3	(1) (a) The State Board of Education, through the state superintendent of public
4	instruction, shall develop and distribute to each school district a school building construction
5	and inspection resource manual.
6	(b) The manual shall be provided to a charter school upon request of the charter school
7	(2) (a) The manual shall include:
8	(i) current legal requirements; and
9	(ii) information on school building construction and inspections, including the
0	guidelines adopted by the State Board of Education in accordance with Section 53A-20-110.
1	(b) The state superintendent shall review and update the manual at least once every

63	(b) "Public school construction" means construction work on a new public school.

66	(ii) consult with the Division of Facilities Construction and Management
67	Administration on proposed guidelines before adoption.
68	(b) The board shall ensure that guidelines adopted under Subsection (2)(a)(i) maximize
69	funds used for public school construction and reflect efficient and economic use of those funds,
70	including adopting guidelines that address a school's essential needs rather than encouraging or

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84	(c) guidelines specific to schools that serve various populations and grades, including
85	high schools, junior high schools, middle schools, elementary schools, alternative schools, and
86	schools for people with disabilities; and
87	(d) year-round use.
88	(5) The guidelines shall address the following:
89	(a) square footage per student;
90	(b) minimum and maximum required real property for a public school;
91	(c) athletic facilities and fields, playgrounds, and hard surface play areas;
92	(d) cost per square foot;
93	(e) minimum and maximum qualities and costs for building materials;
94	(f) design efficiency;
95	(g) parking;
96	(h) furnishing;
97	(i) proof of compliance with applicable building codes; and
98	(j) safety.
99	Section 3. Effective date.
