31	(1) IBC, Section 1505.8 is deleted.
32	(2) IBC, Section 1509.7.2 is deleted.
33	(3) IBC, Section 1509.7.4 is deleted and rewritten as follows:
34	"Photovoltaic panels and modules that are mounted on top of a roof shall:
35	1. Regardless of the roof assembly classification, be listed and labeled with at least a
36	class C fire classification;
37	2. Be listed and labeled in accordance with UL 1703; and
38	3. Be installed in accordance with the manufacturer's installation instructions."
39	(4) Subsections (1) through (3) do not apply if the Legislature adopts, with or without
40	amendment, an edition of the IBC that is more recent than the 2012 edition.
41	Section 3. Effective date.
42	If approved by two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, this bill takes effect
43	upon approval by the governor, or the day following the constitutional time limit of Utah

Constitution, Article VII, Section 8, without the governor's signature, or in the case of a veto,
