68	(2) This chapter may not be construed to authorize any individual licensed under this
69	chapter to engage in any manner in the practice of medicine as defined by the laws of this state.

71	(a) [create or] require insurance coverage or reimbursement for massage therapy from
72	third party payors [if this type of coverage did not exist on or before February 15, 1990]; or
73	(b) prevent [any] an insurance carrier from offering coverage for massage therapy.
