#### **LONG TITLE**

#### **General Description:**

This bill creates the Court System Task Force, composed of {15}19 members, and specifies study issues.

### **Highlighted Provisions:**

This bill:

- creates the Court System Task Force, composed of <15\(\frac{19}{19}\) members;</li>
- requires the task force to study issues regarding the structure, jurisdiction, and organization of the court system in Utah; and
- requires that the task force provide the Judiciary Interim Committee with a report of the task force's recommendations by November 30, 2015.

### Money Appropriated in this Bill:

This bill appropriates in fiscal year  $\frac{2013-14}{2014-15}$ :

- ► to the Senate, as a <del>{one-time}</del> one-time appropriation:
  - from the General Fund, \$9,\{240\}\(\frac{300}{200}\), to pay for the Court System Task Force; and
- ► to the House of Representatives, as a <del>{one-time}one-time</del> appropriation:
  - from the General Fund, \$18, \(\frac{480}{500}\), to pay for the Court System Task Force.

### **Other Special Clauses:**

This bill is repealed on December 1, 2015.

**ENACTS UNCODIFIED MATERIAL** 

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:* 

Section 1. Court System Task Force -- Creation -- Membership -- Quorum -- Compensation -- Staff.

- (1) There is created the Court System Task Force consisting of the following {15}19 members:
- (a) two members of the Senate appointed by the president of the Senate, no more than one of whom may be from the same political party;
- (b) four members of the House of Representatives appointed by the speaker of the House of Representatives, no more than two of whom may be from the same political party;
  - (c) the chief justice of the Utah Supreme Court, or the chief justice's designee;
  - (d) the Utah attorney general, or the attorney general's designee;
  - (e) the executive director of the Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice;
- (f) a member representing the state justice courts, appointed by the chair of the Judicial Council;
- (g) a member representing the state juvenile courts, appointed by the chair of the Judicial Council;
- (h) a member representing the state district courts, appointed by the chair of the Judicial Council;
  - (i) a member of the Judicial Performance Evaluation Commission;
- (\{f\}i) the director of the \{\text{Utah Prosecution Council}\}\{\text{Statewide Association of Public}\}\)
  Attorneys, or the director's designee;

- (<del>{g}k</del>) a representative from the League of Cities and Towns;
- (tht) a member of the Utah Association of Counties;
- ({\fi}m) a member of the Utah Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers appointed by the board of directors;
- (fin) one member of the Utah State Bar who does not practice in the areas of criminal prosecution or defense, appointed by the director; and
- ({k}o) a member of the public with knowledge of and interest in the courts, jointly appointed by the president of the Senate and the speaker of the House of Representatives.
- (2) (a) The president of the Senate shall designate a member of the Senate appointed under Subsection (1)(a) as a cochair of the task force.
- (b) The speaker of the House of Representatives shall designate a member of the House of Representatives appointed under Subsection (1)(b) as a cochair of the task force.
- (3) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum. The action of a majority of a quorum constitutes the action of the task force.
- (4) (a) Salaries and expenses of the members of the task force who are legislators shall be paid in accordance with Section 36-2-2 and Legislative Joint Rules, Title 5, Chapter 3, Legislator Compensation.
- (b) A member of the task force who is not a legislator may not receive compensation for the member's work associated with the task force, but may receive per diem and reimbursement for travel expenses incurred as a member of the task force at the rates established by the Division of Finance under Sections 63A-3-106 and 63A-3-107.
- (5) The Office of Legislative Research and General Counsel shall provide staff support to the task force.

### Section 2. **Duties -- Interim report.**

- (1) The task force shall study the following issues:
- (a) the structure of the current court system, including justice courts, appellate courts, juvenile courts, and district courts;
- (b) whether adding specialized divisions or modifying existing divisions would enhance {the }efficiency {of}or due process within the system;
  - (c) court commissioners;
  - (d) the jurisdictional limits of the different levels of courts;

- (e) options for promoting other avenues of dispute resolution \{; and\}.
- (f) any other issue relating to court organization and efficiency.
- (2) A final report, including any proposed legislation, shall be presented to the Judiciary Interim Committee before November 30, 2015.

Section 3. Appropriation.

Under the terms and conditions of Title 63J, Chapter 1, Budgetary Procedures Act, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014, and ending June 30, 2015, the following sums of money are appropriated from resources not otherwise appropriated, or reduced from amounts previously appropriated, out of the funds or accounts indicated for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014, and ending June 30, 2015. These are additions to any amounts previously appropriated for fiscal year 2015.
