LONG TITLE
General Description:
This bill modifies Title 58, Occupations and Professions, by creating a state
certification designation for music therapists.
Highlighted Provisions:
This bill:
 defines terms, including "state certification," which means a designation granted by
the division on behalf of the state to an individual who has met the requirements for
state certification related to an occupation or profession;
 requires the Division of Occupational and Professional Licensing to grant state
certification to a person who qualifies under this chapter to engage in the practice of
music therapy as a state certified music therapist;
 provides the qualifications and renewal requirements for being a state certified
music therapist, which include the applicant providing satisfactory documentation
of being board certified in good standing with the Certification Board for Music
Therapists or an equivalent board as determined by division rule;
 provides that this act may not be construed to prevent a person from lawfully
engaging in the practice of music therapy without state certification; and
 provides what constitutes unlawful conduct related to the state certification of music
therapy, including that it is unlawful for a person who is not a state certified music

therapist to use the title state certified music therapist, or represent that the person is
