	WHEREAS, the Utah Compact is a declaration of five principles to guide Utah's
imm	igration discussion;
	WHEREAS, the Utah Compact is being supported by numerous business and religious
leade	ers;
	WHEREAS, immigration is a federal policy issue between the United States and other
coun	tries, not Utah and other countries;
	WHEREAS, Utah's congressional delegation and others at the federal level should lead
effor	ts to strengthen federal laws and protect the nation's borders;
	WHEREAS, reasonable policies should be adopted in Utah to address immigrants in

29	WHEREAS, the rule of law and law enforcement officers' professional judgment and
30	discretion should be supported;
31	WHEREAS, local law enforcement resources should focus on criminal activities, not
32	civil violations of federal laws;
