58-63-201. Board -- Duties.

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20	(1) There is created the Security Services Licensing Board consisting of:
29	(a) [two] three individuals who are officers or owners of a licensed contract security
30	company;
31	(b) one individual who is an officer or owner of a licensed armored car company;
32	(c) one individual from among nominees of the Utah Sheriffs' Association;
33	(d) one individual from among nominees of the Utah Chiefs of Police Association; and
34	(e) [two individuals] one individual representing the general public.
35	(2) (a) The executive director shall appoint board members in accordance with Section

- (3) In addition to the exemptions from licensure in Section 58-1-307, an individual holding a valid license as an armed private security officer under this chapter may also function as an unarmed private security officer without the additional license.
- (4) In accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act, the division may make rules approving security apparatus under Subsection (1)(b).
