39	Section 1. Section <b>53B-13b-101</b> is enacted to read:

42	This chapter is known as the "Veterans Tuition Gap Program Act."			
43	Section 2. Section <b>53B-13b-102</b> is enacted to read:

46	(1) "Federal program" means the Post-9/11 Veterans Educational Assistance Act of

68	Section 4. Section <b>53B-13b-104</b> is enacted to read:

70	(1) The board shall use the guidelines in this section to develop policies to implement
