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An executive officer of an organization in control of a cemetery, including a
municipality or a cemetery maintenance district, or an individual owner in control of a
cemetery, shall provide each purchaser of a lot or burial right located in the cemetery with a
certificate of burial rights, properly executed[, and the same may be filed and recorded by the
county recorder of the county within which the cemetery is situated].
Section 3. Section 8-3-3 is amended to read:
8-3-3. Transcripts to be filed for record.
[On the first days of January and July]
(1) No later than January 1 and July 1 of each year [such executive officers and
individual owners offering], the executive officer of an organization in control of a cemetery,
including a municipality or cemetery maintenance district, or an individual owner in control of
a cemetery with burial lots for sale, shall file with the county recorder of the county within
which the [cemeteries are] cemetery is situated a transcript, duly certified by [them] the
