	This part is known as the "Community Health Worker Certification Act."

	(c) applies the individual's knowledge to assist the community with health care issues,

	(iii) promoting self-sufficiency.

	(1) The department shall certify a community health worker if the community health

	(a) as determined by the department, demonstrates:
	(i) basic knowledge of health care principals and health care systems;
	(ii) basic fluency in a language associated with the community the individual intends t
serve
