(c) a specimen from a medical, pathological, pharmaceutical, research, commercial, or

industrial laboratory.

 $\frac{1}{2}$ ($\frac{1}{2}$) Except as provided in Subsection ($\frac{1}{2}$), the division may not approve an operation plan or issue a permit for construction of a new facility that:

(a) incinerates {medical}infectious waste or chemotherapeutic agents; and

(b) is located within a two-mile radius of {a} an area zoned residential {area} on

January 1, 2014.

({3}<u>2</u>) The division may {renew}<u>approve renewal or modification of</u> an operation plan or{renew} a permit for a facility that {does not qualify under Subsection (2) if the facility }<u>is</u> in operation {on}<u>as of</u> May 13, 2014.
