• must be used for law enforcement purposes to reduce crime in areas with
halfway houses;
<ul> <li>creates the Parole Violator Services Account as a restricted account within the</li> </ul>
General Fund;
<ul> <li>provides that the Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice shall administer the</li> </ul>
Parole Violator Services Account;
<ul> <li>provides that funds from the Parole Violator Services Account shall be allocated on</li> </ul>

Center beds in their jurisdiction; and

report on how the funds are used.
